National Roundup

Supreme Court Upholds States' Power to Sub-Classify Scheduled Castes

- ❖ The Supreme Court affirmed on 8th February, 2024, that individual States have the authority to provide **preferential allotment of reservation** benefits to particularly backward groups within the Scheduled Castes without encroaching upon Parliament's power to include or exclude communities from the Presidential list.
- ❖ **Articles 341 and 342** empower the President to **compile lists of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes**, respectively.
- ❖ Parliament regulates the inclusion or exclusion of any caste, race, or tribe from these lists through legislation.
- ❖ The Bench dismissed concerns that sub-classification would lead to the "**Balkanisation of the list**," emphasizing that States have the prerogative to address the unique needs of specific sub-castes.
- ❖ The High Courts have the authority under **Article 226** to scrutinize State decisions on sub-classification, ensuring alignment with empirical data and the objective of promoting equality.
- ❖ The court acknowledged the **risk of political appeasement** and emphasized the importance of States demonstrating objective criteria, such as lack of representation, in identifying backward classes.

Centre Enacts ANRF Provisions

- ❖ On 5th February, the Centre activated the provisions of the **Anusandhan National Research Foundation (ANRF)** and designated Abhay Karandikar, the Secretary of the Department of Science and Technology (DST), as the interim CEO.
- ❖ The ANRF, with an initial corpus of Rs 50,000 crore, predominantly sourced from the private sector, aims to **offer strategic direction for research, innovation, and entrepreneurship** across various domains.
- ❖ The ANRF Act, passed in 2023, has now been brought into force, marking a significant step towards establishing a national research foundation. Finance Minister allocated Rs 2,000 crore for ANRF in the 2024-25 fiscal year.
- ❖ While the ANRF Act has been enacted, the accompanying rules are yet to be made public.

- ❖ The **Department of Science and Technology (DST)** will administer the NRF, overseen by a Governing Board comprising eminent professionals.
- ❖ The **Prime Minister** serves as the **ex-officio President**, and the Union Ministers of Science & Technology and Education are ex-officio Vice-Presidents.
- ❖ The ANRF absorbs the functions of the existing **Science and Engineering Research Board (SERB)** established in 2008, with an expanded mandate to cover a broader range of activities, reinforcing India's research and innovation ecosystem.

Bharat Mobility Global Expo 2024

- ❖ On 2nd February, 2024, Prime Minister addressed the audience and toured the Bharat Mobility Global Expo 2024, India's largest mobility exhibition held at Bharat Mandapam, New Delhi.
- ❖ The expo showcases India's capabilities in the **mobility and automotive value chains**, featuring exhibitions, conferences, buyer-seller meets, and more.
- ❖ Reiterating the goal of '**Viksit Bharat**' by 2047, PM emphasized the pivotal role of the mobility sector, considering it the beginning of a golden period for the industry.
- ❖ Stakeholders were encouraged to **transform the automotive landscape** with the vision of an efficient, sustainable, and inclusive future.

Law Commission Proposes Reforms on Prevention of Damage to Public Property

- ❖ On 2nd February, 2024, the 22nd Law Commission of India presented its findings, encapsulated in Report No. 284, titled "Revisiting the Law on Prevention of Damage to Public Property," to the Government of India.
- ❖ The report addresses the persistent issue of destruction of public property, causing significant financial losses to the public exchequer and inconveniences to the general public.
- ❖ After thorough deliberations, the Law Commission recommends amendments to the **Prevention of Damage to Public Property Act, 1984**.
- ❖ These proposed changes aim to address the gravity of the issue and provide more effective legal mechanisms for preventing and penalizing damage to public assets.



Plans and Policies

Pradhan Mantri Matsya Kisan Samridhi Sah-Yojana (PM-MKSSY)

- ❖ On 8th February, 2024, the Union Cabinet, chaired by Prime Minister, sanctioned the Pradhan Mantri Matsya Kisan Samridhi Sah-Yojana (PM-MKSSY), a sub-scheme under the Pradhan Mantri Matsya Sampada Yojana.
- ❖ The extension of the **Fisheries and Aquaculture Infrastructure Development Fund (FIDF)** aims to bolster the development of fisheries infrastructure, including fishing harbours, fish landing centres, ice plants, cold storage, and fish transport facilities.
- ❖ About 121 fisheries infrastructure projects, totaling Rs 5,588.63 crore, have already been greenlit under the FIDF.
- ❖ The **PM-MKSSY sub-scheme** will operate with 50% public financing, including contributions from the World Bank and the Agence Française de Développement (AFD), with the remaining 50% anticipated from private sector investments.
- ❖ It will **span four years from 2023-24 to 2026-27** across all states and union territories.
- ❖ The scheme **aims to benefit fishers**, aquaculture farmers, fish workers, and fish vendors by facilitating formalization of the fisheries sector and enhancing access to institutional credit.
- ❖ It is projected to **support 6.4 lakh micro-enterprises** and 5,500 fisheries cooperatives, providing access to institutional credit.

Composite Licensing for Insurers

- ❖ On 6th February, 2024, the **Standing Committee on Finance** of the Lok Sabha proposed significant reforms in the insurance sector, suggesting composite licensing for insurers and a reduction in GST rates on health and term policies.
- ❖ The committee advocates for **composite licensing**, enabling insurers to offer life, non-life, and health insurance products under one entity.
- ❖ This move aims to streamline operations, enhance customer choice, and simplify compliance for insurance companies.
- ❖ Highlighting the **deterrent effect of high GST rates** on insurance uptake, especially for health and term policies, the committee recommends a reduction in GST rates. Lower premiums and easier claims

- processing are expected to incentivize policy adoption.
- ❖ Concerned about **uninsured vehicles posing risks on roads**, the committee suggests stricter enforcement measures and data integration to ensure vehicle owners have adequate insurance coverage.
- ❖ To facilitate **long-term investment** opportunities for insurers, the committee proposes extending the maximum tenure of bonds to 50 years.
- ❖ This initiative aims to provide insurers with stable investment avenues and support financial security.

Voluntary Carbon Market Framework in the Agriculture Sector

- ❖ On 29th January, 2024, the Union government launched a framework to promote voluntary carbon markets in agriculture, aiming to **benefit farmers** and encourage environmentally friendly practices.
- ❖ India's farm sector accounts for **14% of the country's total greenhouse gas emissions**, ranking behind electricity (44%) and manufacturing industries and construction sectors combined (18%).
- ❖ The framework has been designed to encourage **small and medium farmers to participate in carbon credit programs**, fostering environmentally sustainable agricultural practices.
- ❖ It aims to not only benefit farmers but also expedite the adoption of eco-friendly agricultural practices.
- ❖ The framework establishes an accreditation system for independent bodies that will verify and certify carbon sequestration projects.
- ❖ In addition to the **carbon market framework**, the **Accreditation Protocol of Agroforestry Nurseries** was also launched to strengthen institutional arrangements for large-scale production and certification of planting material.

Carbon Market

- The concept of a carbon market originated from the **1997 Kyoto Protocol**, operationalizing the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC). It obligated countries to restrict and decrease greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions.
- Carbon market is a platform where **carbon credits are traded to decrease greenhouse gas** emissions.
- Each carbon credit signifies the prevention or removal of one tonne of carbon or its greenhouse gas equivalent.



Bills and Acts

Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Amendment Act, 2024

- ❖ The Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Amendment Act, 2024 received the assent of the President on 15th February, 2024.
- ❖ The Act amends the Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1974.
- ❖ The amendments decriminalises several minor water pollution related violations, and instead imposes penalties.
- ❖ It also exempts specific industrial plants from regulatory restrictions.
- ❖ It will initially apply to Himachal Pradesh, Rajasthan, and the union territories. Other states may pass resolutions to extend its applicability to their states.
- ❖ Union Environment Minister emphasized the necessity for balancing development and environmental protection, **advocating for ease of living** and business operations alongside transparency in addressing water pollution issues.
- ❖ It aims to **rationalize criminal provisions**, ensuring that citizens and businesses operate without the fear of imprisonment for **minor procedural or technical defaults**, aligning penalties with the severity of offenses.
- ❖ The central government gains authority to exempt certain industrial plants from Section 25 restrictions, reducing regulatory burden and duplication of surveillance efforts.
- ❖ Provision is made for the central government to prescribe guidelines regarding the nomination of **State Pollution Control Boards'** chairpersons, ensuring fair appointments and aligning with similar provisions in the Air Act.

The Constitution (Jammu and Kashmir) Scheduled Castes Order (Amendment) Act, 2024

- ❖ The Constitution (Jammu and Kashmir) Scheduled Castes Order (Amendment) Act, 2024 received the assent of the President on 12th February, 2024.
- ❖ The Act amends the Constitution (Jammu and Kashmir) Scheduled Castes Order, 1956.
- ❖ The amendment addresses long-standing demand of several communities in the region.
- ❖ The historic legislation aims to **extend Scheduled Tribe status** to the Pahari Ethnic Group, Padari Tribes, Koli, and Gadda Brahmin communities

in Jammu and Kashmir, fulfilling their enduring aspirations for recognition and empowerment.

- ❖ The inclusion of these communities in the Scheduled Tribes list will not diminish the existing reservation benefits accorded to other Scheduled Tribe groups such as **Gujjars and Bakarwals**. Their reservation entitlements will remain unaffected.
- ❖ Reservation provisions for the **newly recognized Scheduled Tribes** will be implemented in a manner that safeguards the reservation rights of the already listed communities.
- ❖ Necessary notifications on reservation will be issued by the Government of the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir to maintain parity in reservation levels.

The Public Examinations (Prevention of Unfair Means) Act, 2024

- ❖ The Public Examinations (Prevention of Unfair Means) Act, 2024 received the assent of the President on 12th February, 2024.
- ❖ This legislation **proposes stricter penalties**, including imprisonment and hefty fines, for individuals and organized groups involved in exam malpractices.
- ❖ The proposed legislation aims to **curb unfair means in public examinations** and common entrance tests nationwide.
- ❖ It focuses on deterring individuals, groups, or **institutions engaging in unfair means** for wrongful gains, thus safeguarding the integrity of public examinations.
- ❖ The bill clarifies that candidates, as defined, will **not face action under the bill** but will be subject to existing administrative provisions of the relevant examination authority.
- ❖ 'Public Examinations' include exams by various authorities like UPSC, SSC, Railway Recruitment Boards, IBPS, Central Government Ministries, NTA, and others notified by the Centre.
- ❖ Imprisonment for a minimum of **three years, extendable to five years**, and a fine of up to **Rs 10 lakh for unfair means**.
- ❖ For organized crimes, including by examination authorities or institutions, imprisonment for a minimum of five years, extendable to ten years, and a fine of not less than Rs 1 crore. Institution's property may be attached and forfeited, with recovery of the examination cost.
- ❖



Indices & Reports

India Ageing Report 2023

- ❖ **Published by:** United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) and International Institute for Population Sciences (IIPS).
- ❖ **About the Report:** This report sheds light on the challenges, opportunities and institutional responses surrounding elderly care in India.

Highlights

- ❖ **Demographic Projection:** The decadal growth rate of the elderly population of India currently estimated to be at 41%. With this rate, the percentage of elderly population in the country projected to double to over 20% of total population by 2050. By 2046, it is likely that elderly population will have surpassed the population of children (aged 0 to 15 years) in the country.
- ❖ **Population of People Aged 80+:** The population of people aged 80+ years will grow at a rate of around 279% between 2022 and 2050 with a predominance of widowed and highly dependent very old women.
- ❖ **Vulnerabilities of Elders:** More than 40% of the elderly in India are in the poorest wealth quintile, with about 18.7% of them living without an income.

Global Innovation Index 2023

- ❖ **Published by:** World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO) in collaboration with Cornell University, INSEAD, and various organizations and institutions
- ❖ **About the Index:** The Global Innovation Index (GII) evaluates and quantifies the innovation performance of global economies. As per the report, India has maintained its 40th rank, retaining its position as a prominent performer among lower-middle-income countries.

Leading the Innovation Landscape

- ❖ Switzerland continues its impressive streak as the most innovative economy for the 13th consecutive year while Sweden surged to second place.

India in the Index

- ❖ **India Leads the Lower-Middle-Income Economies:** India secured the top position among the 37 lower-middle-income countries and also led the group of 10 economies in Central and South America.

- ❖ **Strong Performance Across Key Innovation Indicators:** India has consistently excelled in innovation for the 13th consecutive year, achieving top rankings in crucial indicators such as ICT services exports (5th place), venture capital received (6th place), graduates in science and engineering (11th place), and global corporate R&D investors (13th place).
- ❖ **Continuous Improvement:** Over the past eight years, India has steadily climbed in the GII rankings, showing remarkable progress. In 2015, India was positioned at 81st place.

Henley Passport Index 2024

- ❖ **Published by:** Henley & Partners, a global citizenship and residence advisory firm.
- ❖ **About the Index:** This index mainly assesses the world's passports according to the number of destinations their holders can access without a prior visa. It encompasses 199 different passports and covers 227 travel destinations.

Key Highlights

- ❖ **Most Powerful Passports:** Six countries have claimed the top spot on the 2024 Henley Passport Index, offering their citizens the most powerful passports with visa-free access to 194 destinations out of 227 around the world. They are - four EU member states — **France, Germany, Italy, and Spain** — and two Asian powerhouses **Japan and Singapore**.
- ❖ **India's Rank:** India is currently ranked **80th** on the 2024 Henley Passport Index, with visa-free access to 62 destinations, including popular tourist destinations like Thailand, Indonesia, Mauritius, Sri Lanka, and Maldives.

Global Peace Index 2023

- ❖ **Published by:** Institute for Economics and Peace (IEP)
- ❖ **About the Index:** This report presents the most comprehensive data-driven analysis to-date on trends in peace, its economic value, and how to develop peaceful societies.
- ❖ This widely recognized index ranks 163 independent states and territories based on their level of peacefulness.



Summits & Conferences

CLEA-Commonwealth Attorneys and Solicitors General Conference

- ❖ On 3rd February, 2024, the Commonwealth Legal Education Association (CLEA)-Commonwealth Attorneys and Solicitors General Conference (CASGC) 2024 was held at Vigyan Bhawan, New Delhi.
- ❖ The theme of the event was “**Cross-Border Challenges in Justice Delivery**”.
- ❖ The Conference deliberated on important issues pertaining to law and justice like: Judicial transition and the ethical dimensions of legal practice; Executive accountability; and Revisiting modern-day legal education, among others.

Commonwealth Legal Education Association (CLEA)

- Founded in 1971, it is a Commonwealth-wide body with regional Chapters and Committees in South Asia, Southern Africa, West Africa, the Caribbean and the UK.
- It fosters and promotes high standards of legal education in the Commonwealth.

South Summit of G77

- ❖ The third South Summit of G77 was held at Kampala in Uganda from 21 to 22 January, 2024, under the theme “**Leaving No One Behind**”.
- ❖ The summit aims to boost South-South cooperation among its 134 member States of the Group of 77 (G-77).
- ❖ The ‘**South Summit**’ is the **supreme decision-making body of the Group of 77**.
- ❖ G-77 is the largest intergovernmental organization of developing countries in the United Nations. India is a member of this group.

19th Summit of the Non-Aligned Movement (NAM)

- ❖ The 19th Summit of the NAM was held on 19-20 January, 2024, in **Kampala, Uganda**, with the theme of “**Deepening Cooperation for Shared Global Affluence**”.
- ❖ **Uganda** has taken over as chair from Azerbaijan, to run **until 2027**.
- ❖ The summit adopted the **Kampala Declaration**, slamming Israeli military aggression and calling for the implementation of the UN Security Council

resolution to allow humanitarian aid into the besieged Gaza Strip.

- ❖ The **NAM was established in 1961 in Belgrade, Yugoslavia**, through the initiative of five leaders of newly independent countries: Josip Broz Tito of Yugoslavia, Gamal Abdel Nasser of Egypt, Jawaharlal Nehru of India, Sukarno of Indonesia, and Kwame Nkrumah of Ghana.
- ❖ At present **NAM has 120 Member States**.
- ❖ **NAM does not have a permanent secretariat** or a formal founding charter, act, or treaty.

9th India International Science Festival

- ❖ The 9th edition of the India International Science Festival (IISF) 2023 was **held at Faridabad**, Haryana from January 17th-20th, 2024.
- ❖ The theme of the present edition was ‘**Science and Technology Public Outreach in Amrit Kaal**’.

12th General Assembly of Asian Buddhist Conference for Peace

- ❖ On 17th January, 2024, the Vice President of India inaugurated the 12th General Assembly of the Asian Buddhist Conference for Peace (ABCP) in New Delhi.
- ❖ The theme of the event was “**The Buddhist Voice of Global South**”.
- ❖ **ABCP was founded in 1970 at Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia** as a voluntary movement of followers of Buddhism with both monastic (monks) and lay members.
- ❖ It is currently **headquartered** at the **Gandantsegchenling Monastery in Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia**.
- ❖ The Indian National Centre of ABCP was formed in New Delhi in 1974.

GPAI Summit

- ❖ **India, the Chair of the Global Partnership on Artificial Intelligence (GPAI)**, hosted the GPAI Summit from December 12 - 14, 2023, at the Bharat Mandapam in New Delhi.
- ❖ The major outcomes achieved during the GPAI summit was - **GPAI New Delhi Declaration** - built the consensus among GPAI members on advancing safe, secure, and trustworthy AI and commitment to supporting the sustainability of GPAI projects.



Art & Culture

Nagara Style of Temple Architecture

- ❖ The Ram Mandir in Ayodhya, consecrated on 22nd January, 2024, is built in the Nagara architecture.
- ❖ Nagara Style originated in the **late Gupta period**, around the **5th century CE**, in **northern India**. Concurrently, the **Dravida style**, also emerging during this period, can be observed in **southern India**.
- ❖ Nagara temples feature a **raised plinth** as their foundation.
- ❖ The **Garbha Griha**, housing the deity's idol, is considered the most sacred area within the temple.
- ❖ The **shikhara**, resembling a mountain peak, stands tall above the Garbha Griha and symbolizes the natural and cosmological order in Hindu tradition.
- ❖ **Amalaka or Kalash** which is installed on Shikhara is another characteristic feature of this form of temple style.
- ❖ These temples typically include a circumambulatory passage around the garbha griha.
- ❖ One or more mandapas (halls) are aligned on the same axis as the garbha griha.
- ❖ Nagara Style can be classified based on the **Style of Shikhara** into **Valabhi, Phamsana, Rekha-Prasad or Latina, Shekhari and Bhumija**.
- ❖ **Odisha School, Chandel School and Solanki School** are Sub-Schools of Nagara Style of Temple Architecture.

Pakke Paga Hornbill Festival

- ❖ The 9th edition of the Pakke Paga Hornbill Festival (PPHF) took place between 18th to 20th January, 2024 in Seijosa in **Arunachal Pradesh's Pakke Kesang district**.
- ❖ The first-ever PPHF was held in **2015**. The aim was to recognise the role played by the **Nyishi tribal group** in conserving hornbills in Pakke Tiger Reserve (PTR).
- ❖ Other objectives were to **raise alternative sources of income** for the region and to create awareness in the rest of India about the wonders of PTR and its surrounding areas.
- ❖ This year, the festival's theme was '**Domutoh Domutoh, Paga hum Domutoh**'. It translates to 'Let Our Hornbills Remain' in the Nyishi language.
- ❖ This year's festival aims to underscore the **critical need for preserving** these iconic birds.

- ❖ **Nyishi Tribe** is the largest ethnic group in Arunachal Pradesh, primarily residing in the districts of Papum Pare, Kurung Kumey, East Kameng, and parts of Lower Subansiri.

Hornbills

- The hornbills (Bucerotidae) are a family of birds found in tropical and subtropical Africa and Asia.
- India is home to nine species of hornbills. The northeastern region has the highest diversity of hornbill species within India.
- **Conservation Status: IUCN: Vulnerable; WPA, 1972: Schedule I; CITES: Appendix I.**

Pakke Tiger Reserve

- It is located in the **East Kameng district** of Arunachal Pradesh.
- It is surrounded by the Tenga Reserve Forest to the North, Doimara Reserve Forest on the West, Nameri National Park and Tiger Reserve (Assam) on the South.

Chandubi Festival of Assam

- ❖ Recently, the Chandubi Festival was celebrated along the Chandubi Lake in the state of Assam.
- ❖ It is organised **every year for five days** starting from the first day of the New Year along the **Chandubi Lake**, which is situated in the state of Assam.
- ❖ The main attractions of the Chandubi festival are the local folk culture, ethnic cuisine, local handloom and dresses, boating, etc.
- ❖ The major aim of the Chandubi Festival is to promote eco-tourism in this biodiversity hotspot of Assam.

Chandubi Lake

- It was created during a massive earthquake in the year **1897**.
- The name Chandubi is derived from two words where '**Chand**' means five and '**Dubi**' means sinking in **Khasi language**.
- This freshwater lake was turned into an economically viable water body that would sustain different communities living around the lake.

Garba Dance included in UNESCO's Intangible Cultural Heritage List

- ❖ The decision was made at the 18th session of UNESCO's Intergovernmental Committee for Safeguarding of ICH in Botswana.



Science & Technology

GSLV-F14/INSAT-3DS Mission

- ❖ On 17th February 2024, Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) successfully launched the GSLV-F14/INSAT-3DS mission from SDSC-SHAR, Sriharikota.

About GSLV-F14

- ❖ Geosynchronous Satellite Launch Vehicle (GSLV) is a three-stage 51.7 m long launch vehicle having a liftoff mass of 420 tonnes.

About INSAT-3DS

- ❖ INSAT-3DS is designed for enhanced meteorological observations and monitoring of land and ocean surfaces for weather forecasting and disaster warning.
- ❖ The satellite will provide improved weather forecasts and meteorological services.
- ❖ It will also provide satellite aided search and rescue services.

PACE Satellite Mission

- ❖ In a milestone for climate science, NASA's PACE satellite mission, aimed at examining ocean health, air quality, and climate change effects, soared into orbit on **8th February**, following a successful launch from Florida's Cape Canaveral Space Force Station aboard a SpaceX Falcon 9 rocket.
- ❖ **Named Plankton, Aerosol, Climate, ocean Ecosystem (PACE)**, the mission aims to unravel the intricate dynamics of Earth's oceans and atmosphere by scrutinizing microscopic life in water and particles in the air, shedding light on crucial factors influencing global warming.
- ❖ Equipped with a **hyperspectral ocean color instrument**, PACE will survey oceans across various light spectrums, facilitating the **tracking of phytoplankton distribution** and identifying harmful algal blooms, aiding fisheries management and environmental monitoring efforts.
- ❖ The satellite carries **two polarimeter instruments to analyze sunlight interaction** with atmospheric particles, providing insights into aerosols, cloud properties, and air quality at different scales, contributing to a comprehensive understanding of ocean-atmosphere interactions and climate change impacts.
- ❖ PACE's observations promise to **revolutionize ocean science**, enhancing our grasp of the ocean's role in the climate system.

- ❖ Coupled with data from other missions like **Surface Water and Ocean Topography**, PACE will catalyze advancements in Earth system understanding, benefiting coastal communities and industries.

Drive to Eliminate Lymphatic Filariasis by 2027

- ❖ The Union Ministry of Health and Family Welfare commenced a **mass drug administration campaign** in India on 8th February, 2024, aiming to eliminate lymphatic filariasis, commonly known as **elephantiasis, by 2027**, three years ahead of the global target.
- ❖ Lymphatic filariasis, categorized as a **neglected tropical disease** by the World Health Organisation (WHO), poses a significant public health challenge in India and globally, being a leading cause of **long-term disability** worldwide.
- ❖ India has set an ambitious goal to eliminate lymphatic filariasis by 2027, aligning with a mission-mode, multi-partner approach to achieve the target ahead of the **global deadline of 2030**.
- ❖ The campaign targets **81 districts across nine endemic states**, including Assam, Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand, Karnataka, Maharashtra, Odisha, Telangana, and Uttar Pradesh, covering a wide geographic area affected by lymphatic filariasis.

Lymphatic Filariasis

- A tropical, parasitic disease that affects the **lymph nodes and lymph vessels**.
- Lymphatic filariasis is spread by **infected mosquitoes**. Their bites deposit a parasite that travels to the lymph system.
- Treatment for filariasis includes **anti parasite drugs and antibiotics**.
- Lymphatic filariasis causes significant disability and disfigurement, with painful manifestations like lymphoedema, elephantiasis, and scrotal swelling.
- India bears nearly 40% of the global burden of this parasitic vector-borne disease.

Microsoft Partners with Sarvam AI to Develop Voice-Based Generative AI

- ❖ On 8th February, 2024, Microsoft announced its collaboration with Indian startup **Sarvam AI** to advance voice-based generative AI and deploy **large language models** on Azure.



Ecology & Environment

Environmentalists Launch 'Coexistence: The Great Elephant Migration' Exhibition in Bengaluru

- ❖ On 3rd February, 2024, Coexistence Consortium introduced a month-long exhibition focusing on man-animal conflict, featuring life-size Lantana elephants to raise awareness about the invasive weed affecting Karnataka's forest ecosystem.
- ❖ The exhibition addresses the serious threat posed by **Lantana camara**, an **invasive weed native to South America**, affecting wildlife movement and biodiversity in **Karnataka's tiger reserves**.
- ❖ Around 100 life-size Lantana elephants displayed across Bengaluru, including 60 in Lalbagh Botanical Garden.
- ❖ Installations **near government buildings**, metro stations, colleges, tech parks, lakes, and green spaces. Over 50 discussions, nature trails, storytelling, street plays, and citizen science contests are part of the initiative.
- ❖ A **round table conference** with tribal community members, scientists, environmentalists, and forest department officials to address man-animal conflict and strategize Lantana removal.
- ❖ Karnataka's Principal Chief Conservator of Forests (Wildlife), stressed continuous awareness efforts and calls for funds for habitat restoration and wildlife corridor reclamation.

Rare Dusted Apollo Butterfly Sighted for the First Time in Himachal Pradesh

- ❖ Dusted Apollo, a rare high-altitude butterfly, was recently spotted and photographed in **Himachal Pradesh**, marking the first documentation of the species in the region.
- ❖ The sighting brings joy to butterfly enthusiasts, indicating a thriving diversity of Apollo butterflies in Himachal Pradesh.
- ❖ Sighted and **photographed in September 2023** during a trek to Manimahesh Lake in Chamba by forest guards Gajinder Verma and Abinash Thakur.
- ❖ Dusted Apollo, discovered in 1890, is known for its **distribution range from Ladakh to West Nepal**, flying between 3,500 to 4,800 meters in the inner Himalayas.
- ❖ Characteristics like the complete discal band on the upper forewing and narrower dark marginal band on the hind wings help identify the Dusted Apollo.

- ❖ **Regal Apollo**, another rare species, also photographed at **Manimahesh**, highlights a positive sign of diverse Apollo butterflies in the region.
- ❖ Apollos are **commercially valuable**, fetching high prices in the poaching industry. Of the 11 Apollo species in Himachal Pradesh, five are declared Scheduled species.

California Hit by Second Atmospheric River

- ❖ On 4th February, 2024, the second consecutive atmospheric river struck California, causing widespread flooding, power outages for nearly 850,000 people, and a rare warning for hurricane-force winds.
- ❖ The storm inundated streets and brought down trees and power lines across the San Francisco Bay Area. Winds reached over 60 mph (96 kph), with some areas experiencing gusts exceeding 80 mph (128 kph).
- ❖ An atmospheric river (AR) is a **long, narrow band of highly concentrated water vapour** in the atmosphere. It is often thousands of kilometers in length and can extend from the tropics to higher latitudes.
- ❖ ARs are responsible **for transporting large amounts of water vapour**, equivalent to the flow of the Amazon River.
- ❖ They are associated with **low-level jet streams** and are capable of connecting tropical moisture sources with mid-latitude regions.
- ❖ ARs are significant contributors to heavy rainfall and can result in intense precipitation events. The concentration of moisture can lead to flooding, especially in regions with complex topography or urban areas.
- ❖ **In colder regions**, atmospheric rivers can contribute to **heavy snowfall**, impacting mountainous areas.

Antarctic Marine Protected Areas Face Severe Acidification Threat

- ❖ A new study published on 4th January, 2024, highlights alarming concerns regarding escalating **acidity levels in the continental shelves of Antarctic Marine Protected Areas (MPAs)** due to heightened greenhouse gas emissions.
- ❖ Continental shelves in **Antarctic MPAs** are prone to more severe acidification than the open ocean, posing a threat to marine ecosystems.



International Roundup

India launched UPI Services in Sri Lanka and Mauritius

- ❖ On 12th February, 2024, Prime Minister launched the Unified Payment Interface (UPI) services in Sri Lanka and Mauritius.
- ❖ He also launched RuPay card services in Mauritius via video conferencing.
- ❖ India's emergence as a leader in **Fintech innovation** and **Digital Public Infrastructure** underscores the significance of sharing developmental experiences with partner countries.
- ❖ The launch aims to enhance **digital connectivity** and facilitate seamless digital transactions between India, Sri Lanka, and Mauritius.
- ❖ India has witnessed an exceptional surge in Unified Payments Interface (UPI) transactions, reaching a staggering **8,572 crore by December 11, 2023**, marking a significant shift towards digital transactions.
- ❖ This growth is part of a larger trend, with UPI transactions surging from 92 crore in FY 2017-18 to 8,375 crore in FY 2022-23, showcasing a compound annual growth rate (CAGR) of **147% in terms of volume**.

National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI)

- It is an umbrella organisation for operating **retail payments and settlement** systems in India.
- It is an initiative of **Reserve Bank of India (RBI)** and **Indian Banks' Association (IBA)** under the provisions of the Payment and Settlement Systems Act, 2007.
- Considering the utility nature of the objects of NPCI, it has been incorporated as a "**Not for Profit**" Company under the provisions of Section 25 of Companies Act 1956 (now **Section 8 of Companies Act 2013**), with an intention to provide infrastructure to the entire Banking system in India for physical as well as electronic payment and settlement systems.

Iran Introduces 15-Day Visa-Free Policy for Indian Tourists

- ❖ On **6th February, 2024**, Iran announced the implementation of a 15-day visa-free policy for Indian tourists visiting Iran, according to a statement from the Iran Embassy.
- ❖ Indian citizens can now enter Iran for tourism purposes **without a visa**, under the new policy.

- ❖ The initiative allows for a **maximum stay of 15 days per visit**, with a restriction of one entry every six months.
- ❖ While the visa abolition benefits tourists entering Iran via air borders, those intending longer stays or multiple entries within six months must obtain appropriate visas from Iranian representations in India.
- ❖ Iran joins several countries in offering **visa-free access** to Indian tourists. Recent examples include **Malaysia, Thailand, and Sri Lanka**, which have relaxed visa regulations to attract more visitors from India.
- ❖ Last year, Malaysia introduced a 30-day visa-free entry for **Indian and Chinese visitors**, subject to security screenings. Thailand also waived entry visa requirements for Indian tourists for six months, effective until May 10, 2024.
- ❖ **Sri Lanka extended** visa-free entry to visitors from **seven countries**, including India, China, and Russia, as part of efforts to enhance tourism and facilitate travel.

Unified Payments Interface (UPI) Launched at Eiffel Tower in Paris

- ❖ The formal launch of India's mobile-based payment system, the Unified Payments Interface (UPI), took place at the iconic Eiffel Tower in Paris during the Republic Day reception, the Indian Embassy announced **on 2nd February, 2024**.
- ❖ UPI facilitates round-the-clock payments through a **virtual payment address** created by users.
- ❖ It integrates multiple bank accounts into a single mobile application, offering seamless fund routing and merchant payments.
- ❖ In 2023, an agreement between **NPCI International Payments Limited (NIPL)** and **France's Lyra Collect** paved the way for implementing UPI in France and Europe.
- ❖ Indian tourists in France are now able to make payments in rupees through the UPI mechanism.

Denmark Unveils Green Fuels Alliance India at GIM 2024

- ❖ On 9th January, 2024, Denmark announced the Green Fuels Alliance India (GFAI) initiative at the Global Investors Meet 2024 (GIM), aiming to enhance



Organizations in News

Economic Community of West African States (ECOWAS)

- ❖ The military regimes in Burkina Faso, Mali, and Niger have announced their withdrawal from the Economic Community of West African States (ECOWAS), citing the bloc as a threat to member states.
- ❖ The Sahel nations, facing challenges of jihadist violence and poverty, have had strained relations with ECOWAS since recent coups. Despite being founding members in 1975, they were suspended and faced heavy sanctions for the overthrow of civilian governments.
- ❖ The leaders of the three nations recently formed an “Alliance of Sahel States” to strengthen their stance.
- ❖ Founded in 1975, ECOWAS is a political and economic union of 15 West African nations (now 12)

International Organisation for Migration (IOM)

- ❖ Amy Pope, a former White House advisor became the first woman to head the International Organization for Migration (IOM), the United Nations’ migration agency.
- ❖ The IOM was established in 1951 as the Intergovernmental Committee for European Migration and became a UN agency in 2016.
- ❖ It is headquartered in Geneva, Switzerland.
- ❖ It has 175 member states including India.

International Sugar Organisation

- ❖ India has been named Chair of the International Sugar Organisation (ISO) for 2024 during the 63rd council meeting in London.
- ❖ The ISO is headquartered in London, United Kingdom with 87 members including India.

National Sugar Institute

- The National Sugar Institute is located in Kanpur, Uttar Pradesh.

Asian Pacific Postal Union

- ❖ Recently, India, for the first time, took over the leadership of the Asian Pacific Postal Union (APPU).
- ❖ Headquartered in Bangkok, Thailand, APPU is an intergovernmental organisation comprising 32 member countries in the Asia-Pacific region.

- ❖ It is the only restricted union of the Universal Postal Union (UPU) in the region, which is a specialised agency of the United Nations.
- ❖ The Union also acts as the regional platform for consultation on key global matters impacting the postal sector.

Central Bureau of Investigation

- ❖ On 1st April 2023, Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) celebrated its diamond jubilee. It was established by a resolution of the Union Ministry of Home Affairs dated April 1, 1963.
- ❖ The Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) is the premier investigating agency of India.
- ❖ It operates under the jurisdiction of the Ministry of Personnel, Public Grievances and Pensions.
- ❖ CBI is exempted from the provisions of the Right to Information Act.
- ❖ CBI is India’s officially designated single point of contact for liaison with the Interpol.

World Cooperative Economic Forum (WCEF)

- ❖ In an effort to bolster the global cooperative movement, leaders and experts from the cooperative sector have come together to establish the World Cooperative Economic Forum (WCEF).
- ❖ The forum is headquartered in New Delhi and aims to represent the interests of over three million cooperatives across the world.

Rail Vikas Nigam Limited (RVNL)

- ❖ The Ministry of Finance elevated Rail Vikas Nigam Limited (RVNL) to the status of a Navratna Central Public Sector Enterprise (CPSE).
- ❖ The Navratna companies are CPSE units that have been granted financial autonomy to invest up to Rs. 1,000 crore without seeking approval from the central government.
- ❖ A Navratna company is upgraded to a Maharatna company when it fulfills the required eligibility criteria.
- ❖ There are currently 13 Maharatna, 16 Navratna companies as on Oct, 2023.

World Meteorological Organization

- ❖ Dr. Abdulla Al Mandous, a meteorologist from the United Arab Emirates (UAE), was elected as the new President of the World Meteorological Organization (WMO) for a four-year term spanning from 2023 to 2027.



States' Roundup

Andhra Pradesh

Caste Census

- ❖ The Government in Andhra Pradesh has initiated a comprehensive caste census, marking the state's commitment to understanding and addressing the complex caste dynamics within its population.
- ❖ Launched with the aid of a specially designed phone app, this ambitious census aims to enumerate all castes in the state.
- ❖ Andhra Pradesh now stands as the second state in the country, following Bihar, to undertake such a comprehensive caste enumeration.
- ❖ The app offers more than 700 caste options for the public to choose from, with a notable inclusion being the 'No caste' option.

Jagananna Amma Vodi Scheme

- ❖ The scheme aims to provide financial assistance to approximately 42 lakh mothers, offering them an annual gift of Rs. 15,000 for sending their children to school.
- ❖ Through the Amma Vodi scheme, approximately 83 lakh students from Class I to intermediate levels will benefit from the financial assistance provided by the state government.
- ❖ By directly supporting mothers, the scheme recognizes their critical role in shaping the educational journey of their children.
- ❖ By extending financial assistance to mothers, the government aims to alleviate any financial burdens associated with their children's education, encouraging them to send their wards to schools.

Mulapeta Port

- ❖ The Chief Minister of Andhra Pradesh has initiated the construction of the Mulapeta Greenfield port in Srikakulam district.
- ❖ The port is estimated to cost Rs. 4,362 crore and is expected to be completed within two years.
- ❖ The district has the advantage of a 193-kilometre long coastline, which constitutes a significant portion of the state's total coastline of 974 kilometers.
- ❖ The development of the Mulapeta greenfield port and the fishing harbor is expected to significantly boost the local economy and create employment opportunities for the people in the district.

Statue of Social Justice

- ❖ The Andhra Pradesh government has unveiled the world's tallest statue of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar, the architect of the Indian Constitution, in Vijayawada.
- ❖ The Statue of Social Justice is the tallest Ambedkar's statue in the world.
- ❖ The Statue of Social Justice is 125 feet tall and is built on an 81-foot plinth, giving a total height of 206 feet.
- ❖ It is the fourth tallest, and the second tallest standing statue in India.
- ❖ The Statue of Social Justice is among the top 40 tallest statues in the world. The second-tallest Ambedkar statue, which is 175 feet, is situated in neighbouring Telangana.

Assam

Gunotsav 2024

- ❖ The Gunotsav 2024 (fifth round) was held between January 3, 2024, and February 9, 2024.
- ❖ Gunotsav is a state Government initiative for improvement of quality of school education.
- ❖ The four core areas viz. scholastic (learning outcomes of children), co-scholastic, infrastructure and community participation are evaluated in Gunotsav exercise.
- ❖ Schools are graded as A+, A, B, C and D on the basis of performance (90% on Scholastic, 5% each on Co-scholastic & other areas and Community Participation & Contributions).
- ❖ This exercise helps in identifying the learning gaps and ensuring taking appropriate remedial measures for attaining grade specific learning outcomes by all children.
- ❖ 'Gunotsav' made its debut in 2017 and the 2024 edition marks the fifth round of this comprehensive exercise, covering all districts of Assam.

Project Gajah Kotha

- ❖ The "Gajah Kotha" campaign has been initiated by Assam to tackle the escalating problem of human-elephant conflict (HEC).
- ❖ This campaign focuses on HEC-affected villages in eastern Assam, where it aims to educate residents about the behaviour, ecology, and cultural significance of elephants in the region, emphasizing the importance of conservation.

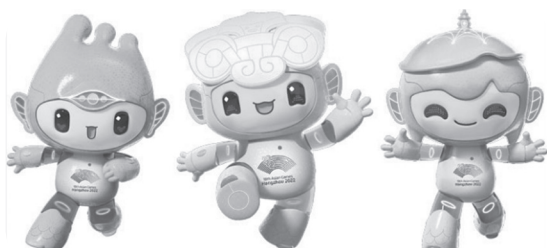
Asian Games

Asian Games 2023 in Hangzhou, the People's Republic of China.

- ❖ It was the first time in Asian Games history that India's medals tally crossed the three-figure mark. By doing so, they became the only fourth country after China, Japan and the Republic of Korea to win 100 or more medals in a single edition of the Asian Games.

- ❖ **Cope India:** The sixth edition of Cope India, an Air Exercise between the Indian Air Force (IAF) and United States Air Force (USAF), conducted at Air Force Stations Kalaikunda, Panagarh and Agra.
- ❖ **Ajeya Warrior:** The 7th edition of biennial joint military exercise "Ajeya Warrior" between India and the United Kingdom was conducted at Salisbury Plains, United Kingdom from 27 April to 11 May 2023. It is conducted alternatively in the United Kingdom and India.
- ❖ **MITRA SHAKTI-2023:** From 16th to 29th November 2023, the ninth edition of Joint Military exercise "MITRA SHAKTI-2023" between India and Sri Lanka was held in Aundh (Pune).
- ❖ **SURYA KIRAN-XVII:** The Army of India and Nepal carried out 17th edition of Joint Military Exercise SURYA KIRAN in Pithoragarh, Uttarakhand from 24th November to 07th December 2023.

Highest Civilian Awards of India

Bharat Ratna 2024

The Government of India announced to confer Bharat Ratna – India’s highest civilian award to five stalwarts - Karpoori Thakur, Lal Krishna Advani, P. V. Narasimha Rao, Chaudhary Charan Singh, and M. S. Swaminathan.

Karpoori Thakur

- ❖ Karpoori Thakur was born on 24 January 1924 at Pitaunjhia (now Karpuri Gram) in Samastipur District of Bihar.
- ❖ Thakur was the Bihar Chief Minister between December 1970 and June 1971 as well as between December 1977 and April 1979.
- ❖ Thakur is notably recognized in Bihar for implementing a complete ban on alcohol in 1970.
- ❖ Thakur was a votary of Hindi language, and as the education minister of Bihar, he removed English as the compulsory subject for the matriculation curriculum.
- ❖ Thakur sowed the seeds for government job reservations for backward classes in the late 1970s by deciding to implement the Mungeri Lal Commission recommendations.



Lal Krishna Advani

- ❖ Lal Krishna Advani was born on 8 November 1927 in Karachi, British India and migrated to India during the Partition.
- ❖ His decades-long service in public life has been marked by an unwavering commitment to transparency and integrity, setting an exemplary standard in political ethics.
- ❖ He was the minister of home affairs from 1998 to 2004 and deputy prime minister from 2002 to 2004.
- ❖ He has served as leader of opposition in both the houses.



Pamulaparthy Venkata Narasimha Rao

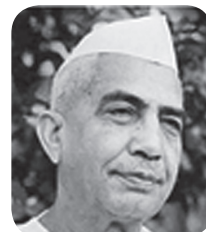
- ❖ P.V. Narasimha Rao was born on 28 June 1921 in the village of Laknepalli, Warangal district of present-day Telangana (then part of Hyderabad State).

- ❖ P.V. Narasimha Rao was the 9th Prime Minister of India (1991 – 1996).
- ❖ He is widely lauded for his pivotal role in introducing economic reforms that rescued the almost bankrupt nation from economic collapse.
- ❖ He also served as the Chief Minister of Andhra Pradesh, Union Defence Minister, Union Minister of External Affairs, and Union Minister of Home Affairs.
- ❖ “Gyan Bhoomi” is the samadhi of Narasimha Rao at Necklace Road in Hyderabad on the banks of Hussainsagar lake.



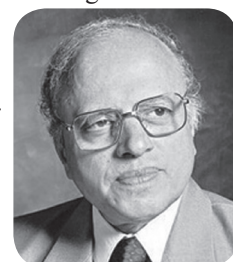
Chaudhary Charan Singh

- ❖ Shri Charan Singh was born in 1902 at Noorpur in Meerut district of Uttar Pradesh.
- ❖ He served as the 5th prime minister of India and 5th Chief Minister of Uttar Pradesh.
- ❖ He was the chief architect of land reforms in U.P.; he took a leading part in formulation and finalisation of the Dept. Redemption Bill 1939, which brought great relief to rural debtors.
- ❖ As Chief Minister he was instrumental in bringing about the Land Holding Act 1960 which was aimed at lowering the ceiling on land holdings to make it uniform throughout the State.
- ❖ Kisan Ghat is the memorial of Chaudhary Charan Singh located in Delhi.



Mankombu Sambasivan Swaminathan

- ❖ Dr. M. S. Swaminathan was an Indian geneticist.
- ❖ Called the ‘Father of the Green Revolution’, he played a major role in the set of changes introduced in farming in the 1960s and ‘70s that helped India achieve food security.
- ❖ He was the first recipient of World Food Prize (1987) for developing and spearheading the introduction of high-yielding wheat and rice varieties.

- ❖ **Lieutenant General Upendra Dwivedi:** He has been appointed as the new Army Vice Chief succeeding Lt Gen MV Suchindra Kumar.
- ❖ **Ahmed Awad bin Mubarak:** Yemen's foreign minister Ahmed Awad bin Mubarak has been appointed as the country's new prime minister.
- ❖ **Rashmi Shukla:** She became Maharashtra's first woman Director General of Police.
- ❖ **Randhir Jaiswal:** He replaced Arindam Bagchi as the official spokesperson of Ministry of External Affairs (MEA).
- ❖ **Mio Oka:** Asian Development Bank appointed Mio Oka as country director for India.
- ❖ **Olzhas Bektenov:** Kazakh President Kassym-Jomart Tokayev signed a decree on Feb. 6, 2024 to appoint Olzhas Bektenov as the new Prime Minister of Kazakhstan.
- ❖ **Justice Prasanna Bhalachandra Varale:** The Chief Justice of the Karnataka High Court has been appointed as Judge of the Supreme Court of India. With this, now, the Dalit representation on the Bench is three.
- ❖ **Justice Sanjiv Khanna:** The senior-most judge of the Supreme Court was appointed as the NALSA Executive Chairperson.
- ❖ **Pankaj Tripathi:** The National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI) has appointed Bollywood actor Pankaj Tripathi as the "UPI Safety Ambassador."
- ❖ **Heeralal Samariya:** He has been appointed as the new Chief Information Commissioner (CIC).
- ❖ **Vineet McCarty:** Vice Admiral Vineet McCarty assumed the position of Commandant at the Indian Naval Academy on January 15, 2024.
- ❖ **Daljit Singh Chaudhary:** He has been appointed as the Director General of Sashastra Seema Bal (SSB).
- ❖ **Anil Kumar Lahoti:** He assumed the role of TRAI Chairman, filling the vacancy left by PD Vaghela.
- ❖ **Jay Shah:** The Secretary of the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) has been appointed for a third consecutive term as the President of the Asian Cricket Council (ACC).
- ❖ **Senthil Pandian C:** He became the new ambassador to the World Trade Organisation (WTO) in Geneva, succeeding Brajendra Navnit.
- ❖ **Girish Chandra Murmu:** The Comptroller and Auditor General (CAG) of India, has been elected as the vice-chair of the UN Panel of External Auditors.
- ❖ **Rahul Navin:** He has been appointed as the Acting Director of Enforcement Directorate.
- ❖ **Tshering Tobgay:** He became the Prime Minister of Bhutan for a second term.
- ❖ **Indra Mani Pandey:** From India, he became the Secretary General of BIMSTEC, succeeding Tenzin Lekphell (Bhutan).
- ❖ **Raghuram Iyer:** He became the CEO of Indian Olympic Association (IOA).
- ❖ **Vikas Sheel:** He has been appointed as the Executive Director of the Asian Development Bank (ADB) in Manila.
- ❖ **Neelkanth Mishra:** He has been appointed as the part-time Chairperson of the Unique Identification Authority of India (UIDAI).
- ❖ **N.V. Ramana:** Former Chief Justice of India (CJI) N.V. Ramana has been appointed as member of the International Mediator Panel of Singapore International Mediation Centre (SIMC).
- ❖ **Alok Sharma:** He has been appointed as the Director of the Special Protection Group (SPG), the elite security unit responsible for safeguarding the Prime Minister.
- ❖ **Rajkumar Rao:** Election Commission of India (ECI) on 26 Oct, 2023 appointed Rajkumar Rao as its 'National Icon' for voter awareness and education.
- ❖ **Edgars Rinkevics:** He has been sworn in as Latvia's first openly gay head of state, and the first openly gay president of an EU member state.
- ❖ **QU Dongyu:** From China, he has been re-elected to a second term as Director-General of the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) of the United Nations.
- ❖ **Admiral Lisa Franchetti:** She became first woman to lead US Navy.
- ❖ **Rakesh Pal:** He has been appointed as the 25th Director General (DG) of the Indian Coast Guard (ICG).
- ❖ **Lieutenant General Raghu Srinivasan:** He has been appointed as the 28th Director General (DG) of the Border Roads Organisation (BRO).
- ❖ **Vice Admiral Dinesh K Tripathi:** He took over as the Vice Chief of the Naval Staff.
- ❖ **Rahul Rasgotra:** He assumed the charge of the Director General, ITBP on 1st January 2024.



Obituary

- ❖ **Dr Nitya Anand:** He was the driving force behind Centchroman's discovery, also referred to as "Saheli." It was the first and only once-weekly, non-steroidal, non-hormonal oral contraceptive pill in history. Saheli was incorporated into the National Family Programme of India in 2016. It is still the only non-hormonal, non-steroidal contraceptive available worldwide.
- ❖ **Prabha Atre:** She was an Indian classical vocalist from the Kirana gharana. She was awarded all three of the Padma Awards by the Government of India.
- ❖ **Malini Rajurkar:** She was an Indian Hindustani classical singer of Gwalior Gharana. She was awarded Sangeet Natak Academy Award in 2001.
- ❖ **Saroja Vaidyanathan:** She was an Indian choreographer, guru, and notable proponent of Bharatanatyam. She was conferred the Padma Shri in 2002 and the Padma Bhushan in 2013.
- ❖ **Rashid Khan:** He was an Indian classical musician in the Hindustani tradition. He belonged to the Rampur-Sahaswan gharana, and was the great-grandson of gharana founder Inayat Hussain Khan. He was awarded the Padma Shri, as well as the Sangeet Natak Akademi Award in 2006. He was awarded the Padma Bhushan in 2022.
- ❖ **N. K. Desam:** He was a Malayalam-language poet and literary critic from Kerala. In 2009, his poetry collection Mudra won the Kerala Sahitya Akademi Award. In 2017, his Malayalam transliteration of Gitanjali by Rabindranath Tagore was selected for the Kendra Sahitya Akademi Translation Prize.
- ❖ **Jitendra Pal Singh Uberoi:** He was an Indian sociologist and philosophical anthropologist. He was a Professor of Sociology from the Delhi School of Economics. Uberoi was instrumental in establishing sociology as a discipline of study in post-colonial India.
- ❖ **Gogi Saroj Pal:** She was a renowned feminist painter.
- ❖ **Ved Prakash Nanda:** He was an Indian-American academic who received the Padma Bhushan award on 20 March 2018 in the field of literature and education.
- ❖ **Munawwar Rana:** He was an Indian Urdu poet. He was honoured with the Sahitya Akademi Award in 2014 for his poem Shahdaba but returned in 2015.
- ❖ **Mohammad Shamim Jairajpuri:** He had been a Dean at AMU and received the first Janaki Ammal National Award in 1999, bestowed by the Government of India, Ministry of Environment and Forests and Lifetime Achievement Award from the Zoological Society of India for his notable works on taxonomy of nematodes.
- ❖ **Sukhbir Singh Gill:** He was Chandigarh's first hockey Olympian. He had represented India at the Sydney Olympics (2000), the Hockey World Cup in Kuala Lumpur (2002), and the FIH Champions Trophy in Cologne (Germany) in 2002.
- ❖ **Thanga Darlong:** He was an Indian folk music artist, known for his contribution to the folk music of Tripura and his work in preserving and promoting the traditional instrument Rosem. He was awarded the Padma Shri (2019); Sangeet Natak Akademi Award (2014).
- ❖ **V. Mohini Giri:** She was former chairperson of the National Commission for Women and a dedicated advocate for the women's movement. She was Chairperson of the Guild of Service, a New Delhi-based social service organisation. She founded War Widows Association, New Delhi in 1972. In 2007, she was awarded the Padma Bhushan.
- ❖ **MS Swaminathan:** M.S. Swaminathan was an agricultural scientist and a key architect of the country's 'Green Revolution'. He founded the MS Swaminathan Research Foundation (MSSRF) in 1988, using the proceeds from the First World Food Prize he was awarded in 1987. He was also awarded Padma Shri (1967), Ramon Magsaysay Award (1971), Padma Bhushan (1972), and Padma Vibhushan (1989)
- ❖ **Giorgio Napolitano:** Giorgio Napolitano was Italy's longest-serving president and the first in the nation's history to be reelected to the office.
- ❖ **N Valarmathi:** She was an Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) scientist, who lent her voice to countdowns for rocket launches in Sriharikota. She was last heard during the countdown announcement for the launch of Chandrayaan-3 that made a historic landing on the Moon.
- ❖ **Henry Alfred Kissinger:** He served as United States secretary of state and national security advisor in
